Local Interference is an interruption into WORKS|PROJECTS' normal programme to present 3 one week-long projects with three of the most interesting artists emerging from the South West.

Each of the projects forms a discrete solo exhibition of new work by one of the three artists but also builds to create a dialogue on the limits of sculpture and how sculpture can be suggested through other forms. Using media as diverse as printing, sound, film and ice the three artists explore sculpture as event as well as object, and the gallery as a testing ground for new ideas.

Hannah James' work is concerned with the experience of an artwork, wanting to describe the process of actively engaging with an object. Recent work has presented constructed spaces, involving found and made pottery displayed in front fabricated screens, which are depicted in slide projections and 16mm film. Black cats are seen wandering around block printed structures, small groups of naively made pots stand in as props - inanimate objects awaiting activation.

James has described image and object as being positioned as antagonists, repeatedly undermining and challenging one another. For Local Interference, James will make a site-specific response to WORKS|PROJECTS using projected images alongside block print direct onto the gallery walls, addressing the gallery as an explicitly theatrical setting.

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Mike Ricketts' work continually invokes the bureaucratic and intellectual structures of architecture, urban planning and policy as both subject and location for his work, but presents this context as a site populated by talisman-like objects as much as regulation and rules.

For Local Interference, Ricketts will present a new sculpture that has the appearance of an arcane suburban weapon. An 8 foot tall pike with a lethally sharpened point, the spear-like object is adorned with hanging-basket brackets and metal house numbers, roughly welded to its shaft. Closer scrutiny can unpick that the numbers form a Bristol phone number – that of the UK planning inspectorate.

The weapon will be accompanied by a number of large-scale spray paint drawings that echo the material components of the object to create renditions of almost 3-dimensional depth, colour fields within which isolated numbers float like ghosts, denoting some unknown significance.

Marie Toseland's work brings together unexpected combinations of objects and experiences to create artworks that explore contradictory ideas of stillness and spectacle, expectation and event.

Her works can combine demur abstract prints with deafening hip-hop, pornographic description with ice sculpture, embroidered fabric and raw concrete. For Local Interference Toseland will present a new work made especially for the programme which will combine ice with raw amplified sound to create a sculptural event within which sound is cast as the sculptural agent.

Mike Ricketts was born in Sheffield in 1971 and was educated at Chelsea College of Art and Design and Courtauld Institute of Art, London. He lives and works in Somerset and London. Recent exhibitions include *Zero Budget Biennial*, Rokeby, London, *Subject | Matter*, Cass Sculpture, Goodwood, Sussex, *Ouagadougou Rendez-vous*, Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso, *Crystal Palace (Destroyed)*, WORKS|PROJECTS, Bristol, *Reverse Consultation (Old New Town), Art and the New Town*, Harlow, Essex, and *Building, Dwelling, Thinking*, Laura Bartlett Gallery, London.
